




Discovering the Beauty of Marital Sexual Love


Methods of Interpretation


Method of Interpretation: Literal

- 1-100 scale vs. symbols



- 9 My lover is like a gazelle or a young stag. Look! There he stands behind our wall, gazing through the windows, peering through the lattice.




Song 2:8-13 Springtime Visit

- 12 Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come, the cooing of doves is heard in our land.





- 2 I will get up now and go about the city, through its streets and squares; I will search for the one my heart loves. So I looked for him but did not find him.




Song 3:5 Shulamith's Warning


The Wedding Day

Song 3:6-11 The Procession

- 6 Who is this coming up from the desert like a column of smoke, perfumed with myrrh and incense made from all the spices of the merchant?
- 7 Look! It is Solomon's carriage, escorted by sixty warriors, the noblest of Israel,
- 8 all of them wearing the sword, all experienced in battle, each with his sword at his side, prepared for the terrors of the night.




Song 3:6-11 The Procession

- 9 King Solomon made for himself the carriage; he made it of wood from Lebanon.
- 10 Its posts he made of silver, its base of gold. Its seat was upholstered with purple, its interior lovingly inlaid by the daughters

of Jerusalem.



Song 3:6-11 The Procession 11 Come out, you daughters of Zion, and look at King Solomon wearing the crown, the crown with which his mother crowned him on the day of his wedding, the day his heart rejoiced.

- 4 Take me away with you let us hurry!Let the king bring me into his chambers.


Shulamith in the Palace (1:2-4a)

- Honeymoon better than wedding
- Anticipate kisses
- Enjoys aftershave
- Anticipates being alone
- "Friends"

We rejoice and delight in you; we will praise your love more than wine.

5 Dark am I, yet lovely, O daughters of Jerusalem, dark like the tents of Kedar, like the tent curtains of Solomon.

Song 1:4-6 Shulamith's Insecurity

6 Do not stare at me because I am dark, because I am darkened by the sun. My mother's sons were angry with me and made me take care of the vineyards; my own vineyard I have neglected.

In the Bridal Chamber (1:46-2:7)

- Solomon reassures his wife about her body


A gift has romance value when the gift:

- is not necessary.









- Black sheets




Bedroom Atmosphere: Sound

- Should turn off automatically




Bedroom Atmosphere: Smell

- Perfume or powdered sheets





3 Like an apple tree among the trees of the forest is my lover among the young men. I delight to sit in his shade, and his fruit is sweet to my taste.





experiences.


Song 4:1-3 Solomon's Description

- 5 Your two breasts are like two fawns, like twin fawns of a gazelle that browse among the lilies.




Song 4:4-7 Solomon's Description

12 You are a garden locked up, my sister, my bride; you are a spring enclosed, a sealed fountain.






Song 4:16 Shulamith's Invitation
